


## Example of How to Write a Social Script

### Title

Introduces the topic/  
scenario

My name is...If I don't know what to do I can ask for help.



Sometimes I need to ask  
the teacher for help.

It's okay to ask for help  
when I don't know what to  
do.

### Perspective Sentence

Makes the script personal  
for the child and more  
specific to them. It appeals  
to their literalness.




I put my hand up to attract  
the teacher's attention.

I look towards the teacher.

### Coaching Sentence

Keeps it positive and tells  
the child what to do.



Sometimes the teacher  
is busy with someone  
else, that is okay I can  
wait for help.

### Alternative Scenario

Include likely scenarios  
to avoid anxiety



When the teacher has  
finished with the other  
student I can call out in a  
medium voice, "Excuse  
me."

### Descriptive Sentence

Teaches the social skills  
necessary in the scenario



I wait for the teacher to  
look at me and say my  
name.

I then ask my question.



Thank You

When the teacher has  
answered my question I  
say, "Thank you."

### Conclusion -> Affirmation

Positively reinforces and  
restates the original  
purpose with addition  
information

It is okay to ask the teacher for help if I don't know  
what to do.
